

Likewise, the strength of a state is the sum of its resources, which include the size of its population, its size and geographical reach, the quality of its workforce, and its competitiveness in the international arena. In fact, many states use military force to secure their interests, and some states engage in military aggression in order to achieve their foreign policy goals.^[@CR1]^ Although conventional military forces are composed of soldiers, policemen, and soldiers who serve in noncombatant roles, they are the instrument for a state's exercise of power.^[@CR2]^ Armed conflict will inevitably ensue, as states are continually armed and thus seek to protect their national interests by intervening in other states. Nevertheless, the intensity of armed conflict is influenced by a number of factors. For instance, if there is an escalation of armed conflict, the cost to the participating states will be higher.^[@CR2]^ The factors that influence the dynamics of an armed conflict are an interesting subject to study, for understanding the escalation of an armed conflict is essential for the prevention of international armed conflict.^[@CR3]^ In fact, understanding the dynamics of an armed conflict may be a useful tool for avoiding a military conflict, because once a military conflict has been initiated, the most important aspect is the decision to escalate the conflict.^[@CR3]^ Three mechanisms are often used to explain how a state gains an advantage in an armed conflict: the threat of force, the use of force, and the credibility of force.^[@CR4]^ The threat of force is defined as an assertion of state strength through force.^[@CR4]^ The use of force is defined as the actual employment of force, which may include conventional military force as well as the use of force to achieve other goals.^[@CR4]^ Finally, the credibility of force is defined as a state's perceived capacity to carry out and sustain the use of force. [@CR4] Despite the importance of the credibility of force, there has been relatively little research into the credibility of force. Some studies that did address the credibility of force focused on how a state may benefit from exercising its military power. For instance, in the 1950s, many countries feared that the Soviet Union could seek to create instability in their foreign relations.^[@CR5]^ Therefore, these countries adjusted their strategy so that they 82157476af
